

MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF SWANTON ABBOTT HELD ON 29th. AUGUST 2023 at 7.00p.m. in the VILLAGE HALL, SWANTON ABBOTT.

PRESENT –Cllrs. M. Vaughan (Chair), S. Day, G McAnsh and Hodson, the Clerk G Kimmerling, & 3 members of the public.

Concern was raised over the content of Agenda items 23.33 & 23.36.

Some of the footpaths are in a poor condition or very overgrown and impassable. FP2 from Sandfields Cottage is very bad. The footpaths have become narrower over the years. It was requested that any footpath problems should be reported immediately.

There was concern over Affordable Housing on Plot B and it was felt there was a prejudicial interest by one of the Councillors. Prejudicial Interests should be included in the Standing Orders.

Cllr. Day said there is not an anti-housing development group in the village. He had responded to the letter, alluded to by the member of the public, to the Parish Council.

23.47	<p><u>BROADBAND AND MOBILE PHONE UPDATE</u></p> <p>Cllr. McAnsh said James Nixon, site engineer for On Wave, had visited the Village Hall and carried out a feasibility study on the provision of installing satellite broadband. This would require a satellite dish on the school side of the hall and a cabinet for the router in the hall with a power source. The reception for terrestrial broadband signal is not great and EE was the best option and could be a backup provider. He will submit a report.
